












GREATNESS: PART 4

The movie business didn't start in California, but by the early twentieth century it had begun to concentrate in a little hamlet near Los Angeles called Hollywood. In the main, the movie pioneers were young immigrants from Eastern Europe who went West to find fame and fortune. Within a few years, their small companies became famous movie studios. The founders ("Movie Moguls") hired directors with names like Griffith, DeMille, Ford, Capra and Hitchcock, and later, names like Allen, Scorsese, Eastwood and Spielberg. They hired a long procession of stars who have lit up the screen for over a century. This study group will trace the history of the American movie industry from its early days to when it became an institution of world-wide appeal and importance. Note longer time period.
