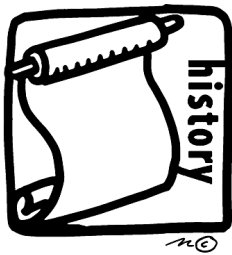
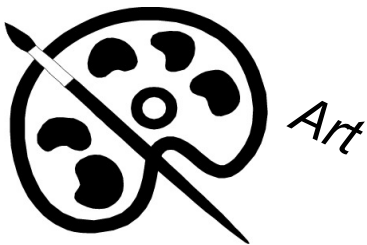

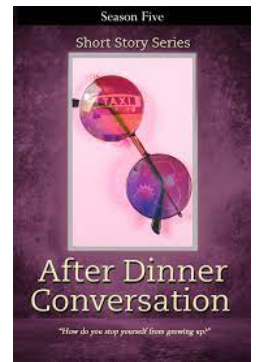
AFTER DINNER CONVERSATION

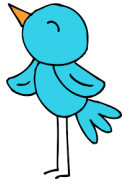
March 24-May 12
